There are 4 positions available:

1. Community Outreach Worker

APPLY FOR THIS POSITION

Qualifications: SF Resident Ages 17 to 24

Position Description: Community Outreach Workers are a group of young leaders who work directly in the community. As front-line staff, Outreach Workers provide youth and their allies with resources, information and employment opportunities. Outreach Workers inform the community about CHALK programs and build connections throughout San Francisco.

2. Youth Funding Youth Ideas (YFYI) Community Funder

APPLY FOR THIS POSITION

Qualifications: SF Resident Ages 14 to 17 Interest in social justice

Position Description: Community Funders are responsible for giving grants to youth-led projects that want to create change in their communities. Community Funders interview applicants, facilitate workshops, manage social media and decide which youth-led projects to give money to so that young people can lead their own projects. Community Funders will decide how to give out \$200,000!

3. YouthLINE Technology Intern

APPLY FOR THIS POSITION

Qualifications: SF Resident Ages 16 to 24 Interest in digital media technology

Position Description: YouthLINE Technology Interns will get hands-on experience with real-world digital media technology. Interns will be given creative assignments, including hosting our live television show, web design, photography, podcasting and journalism. Youth learn to use software that include Adobe Suite, Wix, and more! Interns also create short videos and commercials, usually focused on topics youth are most interested in.

3. HOPE SF Champions

APPLY FOR THIS POSITION

Qualifications: SF Resident (**Sunnydale, Potrero Hill, Alice Griffith and Hunters View**) Ages 16 to 24 Must be able to meet 3-4 times a week, including some weekends

Position Descriptions: The HOPE SF Champions represent the potential of youth power. Our Champions participate in an 18-month paid leadership development, service learning program that aims to disrupt hopelessness in public housing. Over their term, Champions receive over 80 hours of leadership training, work closely with SF Mayor's Office and run youth-led projects that benefit residents in HOPE SF communities. Champions are highly motivated to be the voice of public housing. Given their lived experience, they are highly qualified and effective in conducting peer to peer community engagement and act as liaisons to residents in public housing. Champions are trusted agents of social change.

THE CODE OF THE CHAMPION

Champions believe in the power of young people; to act, to lead and to mobilize.

Champions are accountable to each other and to the communities we represent.

Champions are dependable and act with integrity; we follow through and stand by our words, actions and values.

Champions are resilient; we persevere through challenges and support each other.

Champions believe in equity and social justice; it is our duty to be fair and just, and to challenge systems to do the same.

Champions embrace diversity and practice inclusion; we recognize the importance of including people with varying backgrounds, experiences and abilities.

Champions advocate economic self-sufficiency; we believe in the importance of intergenerational economic mobility through access to career pathways, obtaining entrepreneurial skills, and asset development.

If you are selected, you are required to take part in case management, career coaching, job readiness and life skills training.
